

LEVEL OF FITNESS

To get the most from your Bunnik Tour you will need a good level of fitness and mobility and an open mind. Many of the best sights can only be accessed on foot. You should be able to walk at least 3.5km on uneven ground, climb several flights of stairs and be prepared to board small boats. You should also be able to carry your own bags as porter services may not always be available. Passengers who are 70 and over will be required to obtain a doctor's clearance before travelling.





How to Book

To confirm your booking, we will need a non-refundable deposit of \$1,000 per person.

You will also need to arrange travel insurance. Unfortunately this is not a choice, it's compulsory as we'd hate for something to happen and you not be covered.

Payment Schedules

About 4-8 weeks after your booking has been confirmed, we'll request a progress payment in order to cover airfares, taxes and fuel surcharges. The progress payment is \$3,000 per person for South & Central America. This amount increases if you are flying premium, business or first class.

This payment allows us to issue your flight tickets and ensures you don't get hit with airline increases on fuel surcharges and taxes.

Your final balance is due 90 days before you depart. You'll find our cancellation policy and other terms and conditions in the back of this brochure.

Day 3. Cuenca

Ecuador is the heart of Panama hat manufacturing and today we visit a hat factory, before exploring the UNESCO World Heritage-listed former Incan town of Cuenca. Our sightseeing includes La Catedral Nueva, Plaza Calderon and Plaza de Carmen. [B]

Day 4. Cuenca - Guamote

We make our way to Guamote, stopping in Alausi to board the famous train to the Devil's Nose, one of Ecuador's best rail journeys. [B,D]

Day 5. Guamote - Banos

This morning we tour the Inti Sisa educational centre before heading to the Guamote Market, one of the most colourful and authentic markets in Ecuador. [B,L]

➤ **Special Experience: Visit the Palacio Real Community for lunch and enjoy some llama tasting if you're game!**

Day 6. Banos

We travel into the Amazon Rainforest and take a short hike to the Devil's Cauldron waterfall, located on the impressive Pastaza River Gorge. [B,L]

Day 7. Banos - Otavalo

Departing Banos, we head to Otavalo, famous for textiles and its Handicraft Market. It's the perfect place to pick up some souvenirs! [B,D]

Day 8. Otavalo

➤ **Special Experience: We board the Libertad Train to enjoy one of the most scenic train rides in Ecuador, travelling from the Andean Mountains of Ibarra through the cloud forest and subtropical landscape of Salinas. [B]**

Day 9. Otavalo - Papallacta

We journey through the Andes to a beautiful rose plantation continuing to Papallacta, famous for its hot springs where we can enjoy a soak! [B]

Day 10. Papallacta - Quito

We travel to Quito, the capital of Ecuador. [B]

Day 11. Quito - Lima

We explore Quito's colonial 'Old Town'. Our sightseeing includes Independence Square and the beautiful Church of the Society of Jesus. We stop at the 'Middle of the World' where we can stand with one foot on each equator. Later, we fly to Lima. [B]

Day 12. Lima - Amazon Jungle

After flying to Iquitos we take a short boat ride along the mighty Amazon River to our jungle lodge, where we meet our Amazon guides. [B,L,D]

Day 13. Amazon Jungle

Today we begin with a canopy walk in Sucusari Reserve, before visiting a local shaman to learn about the medicinal uses of the local plants. [B,L,D]

Day 14. Amazon Jungle

After breakfast, we cruise to a local village (spot the pink dolphins), before visiting Neiser's Reserve, home to numerous species of monkey. [B,L,D]

Day 15. Amazon Jungle - Cusco

Today we fly to Cusco via Lima. [B]

Day 16. Cusco

We visit the fortress of Sacsayhuaman and the Incan baths at Tambomachay. Later we'll see the

Cathedral of Santa Domingo and Koricancha (Temple of the Sun). [B]

Day 17. Cusco - Sacred Valley

Another opportunity to pick up souvenirs as we visit impressive ruins and the lively market at Pisac. [B]

Day 18. Sacred Valley

This morning we climb a steep stone staircase to the archaeological ruins of Ollantaytambo, an impressive Incan fortress. Later we explore the salt ponds at Maras and the elliptical terraces of Moray. [B]

◆ **Special Experience: Enjoy a drink of chicha and taste some guinea pig at a local Chicheria.**

Day 19. Sacred Valley - Machu Picchu

Get your camera ready as we travel by train through the scenic Sacred Valley to the famed Lost City of the Incas - Machu Picchu. The sheer scale of this place will take your breath away. [B,D]

Day 20. Machu Picchu - Cusco

There is time this morning to return to Machu Picchu for a second, optional, visit. Later we visit Chinchero for a weaving demonstration before travelling to Cusco. [B]

Day 21. Cusco

Take time to explore the amazing city of Cusco. [B]

Day 22. Cusco - Lake Titicaca

We travel through the majestic High Andes Mountains to Puno on the shores of Lake Titicaca. On arrival, we visit the floating Uros Islands, made entirely out of reeds. [B]

Day 23. Lake Titicaca

We cruise across Lake Titicaca by hydrofoil, visiting the Sun & Moon Islands and enjoying magical alpine views of the Andes. [B,L]

Day 24. Lake Titicaca - Lima

Today we fly to Lima, Peru's largest city. [B]

Day 25. Lima

We explore Lima's sights including the Plaza Mayor, San Francisco Convent and the Larco Museum. [B]

Day 26. Lima - Iguazu Falls

Our tour takes us to Iguazu Falls, one of the world's most spectacular waterfalls. [B]

Day 27. Iguazu Falls

We explore the Argentinian side of Iguazu Falls, and stand on a platform suspended over the incredible Devil's Throat! [B]
